Light Flyweight	over 44 kg not exceeding 46 kg
Flyweight	over 46 kg not exceeding 48 kg
Bantamweight	over 48 kg not exceeding 51 kg
Featherweight	over 51 kg not exceeding 54 kg
Lightweight	over 54 kg not exceeding 57 kg
Light Welterweight	over 57 kg not exceeding 60 kg
Welterweight	over 60 kg not exceeding 63.5 kg
Light Middleweight	over 63.5 kg not exceeding 67 kg
Middleweight	over 67 kg not exceeding 71 kg
Light Heavyweight	over 71 kg not exceeding 75 kg
Heavyweight	over 75 kg not exceeding 81 kg
Super Heavyweight	over 81 kg

- 1. The Amateur Boxing Alliance (England) CIC Female Senior Championships shall be governed by the entry conditions set out below. These conditions may vary from the Rule Book currently in print.
- 2. Competing boxers may be female British or Non-British and must be registered with the Amateur Boxing Alliance and have a competition record card (ME3). Boxers must represent the club shown on the entry form, throughout the Championship. The competition is only open to boxers who are at least 18 years of age on closing date of entry. The boxer must declare numbers of competitive bouts in other contact sports. These numbers must be declared in the boxer's ME3. Acceptance of entry does not necessarily imply that the entrant is eligible or that she will be allowed to compete. Those in doubt as to their eligibility should refer their case to the Hon. Secretary of their Association. Non- British competitors must have held an ME3 card for 1 year from the date of their first medical, shown in the ME3.
- 3. A boxer, who has relinquished her professional boxing licence and has re-registered as an Amateur, is not allowed to enter these Championships until 12 months has elapsed from the date of her first medical on return, shown in the ME3.
- 4. The weight entered on the form is the weight the competitor will box in the championship. Once the entry form has been accepted, boxers will not be able to move weights
- 5. By entering these Championships, the boxer will have been deemed to give consent to allow her name, photographs and video footage to be used in all media for publicity purposes, if required. Video recording or photography in the weigh-in area, changing rooms or warm up areas is strictly forbidden.
- 6. The entry form must be signed by the competitor, giving her correct name, date of birth and address. The Hon. Secretary of the competitor's club or organisation must also sign the entry form, to verify that the competitor's details are correct.
- 7. During the 2-hour Weigh in period, boxers may have as many check weighs as they wish up to the official closure of the scales.
- 8. Competitors must wear singlet vest and boxing shorts when weighing-in. Only the Official in Charge, Medical Officer and Female Chaperone are allowed at the weigh-in.
- 9. Gloves boxers will wear 10oz Alliance approved gloves up to 63.5kg weight category and 12oz gloves, above 63.5kg weight
- 10. A boxer may have a maximum of 2 Coaches in her corner. Training shoes or boxing boots, tracksuits or suitable sportswear must be worn by all Coaches. Shorts must not be worn. Civilian clothing must not be worn. No head wear to be worn by any ringside coach. Mobile phones or other electrical devices are not permitted at ringside.
- 11. ME3s must be produced at the time of time of weighing in at all stages of the Championships. A competitor, parent or guardian must sign a declaration that the boxer is not pregnant.
- 12. For the Pre Quarter Final and Quarter Final matches, appointed Officials will be paid expenses by their own Association. Official's expenses for the Semi Finals and Finals to be paid by the Amateur Boxing Alliance.
- 13. All boxers must wear a gum shield, groin protector, approved bandages on the hands and an approved head guard head, when competing. Red or part thereof gum shields are debarred. Breast protectors are optional but are recommended.
- 14. Where both boxers in the eliminating round of a weight class are disqualified, the Association or Associations jointly concerned will be permitted to nominate a representative to the next stage, provided the nominee has entered and weighed-in for her Association Championships.
- 15. All participants i.e. boxers and coaches, are reminded that these Championship are subject to Alliance Anti -Doping Rules.
- 16. Scoring clickers, using 3 judges, shall be used at all stages of these Championships.
- 17. If there is no opponent for a boxer to compete in the National Final, she will be only be awarded the National Title if she has boxed at an earlier stage.
- 18. If necessary, to define the 'belt' line, competitors will be required to wear the appropriate colour sash. No boxer shall wear a RED vest in the BLUE corner or a BLUE vest in the RED corner.
- 19. All boxers MUST wear a RED head guard and gloves in the RED corner and a BLUE head guard and gloves in the BLUE corner.
- 20. Boxer's hair shall be **TOTALLY** contained within the head guard.
- 21. Competitors will box 4 x 2 minute rounds.
- 22. Forms and a cheque for £10 must be sent to the Alliance Championship Secretary below. Cheques should be made payable to the association where the boxer is registered with i.e. Home Counties ABA, London ABA or South West ABA. If paid by Bank Transfer, a copy of the payment must be enclosed with the application or sent via email attachment to Des Charnock.
