Light Welterweight	over 60 kg not exceeding 63.5 kg
Welterweight	over 63.5 kg not exceeding 67 kg
Light Middleweight	over 67 kg not exceeding 71 kg
Middleweight	over 71 kg not exceeding 75 kg
Light Heavyweight	over 75 kg not exceeding 81 kg
Cruiserweight	over 81 kg not exceeding 86 kg
Heavyweight	over 86 kg not exceeding 91 kg
Super Heavyweight	over 91 kg

## **Rules Governing these Alliance Senior Open Championships**

- 1. The Championships shall be governed by the entry conditions set out below, which may vary from time to time with the Rule Book currently in print.
- 2. Competitors must be Senior Boxers (British or Non-British) and must be registered with the Amateur Boxing Alliance (England) CIC. Competitors must represent the Club on the entry form throughout the Championship. The Championships are open to MALE Boxers who are at least of 18 years of age by the closing date of application, but a boxer, once having reached 40 years of age, will not be allowed to enter or continue in these Championships. They must have had a minimum of 2 Alliance or EB competitive bouts. Competitors shall declare all details of competitive bouts in other combat sports. These numbers must be entered at the top on page 1 on the Boxer's Medical Card. Acceptance of entry does not necessarily imply that the entrant is eligible or that he will be allowed to compete. Those in doubt as to their eligibility should refer their case to the Hon. Secretary of their Association.
- 3. The weight entered on the form is the weight the competitor will box in the championship. Once the entry form has been accepted, boxers will not be able to move weights
- 4. The entry form must be signed by the competitor, giving his correct Name, Date of Birth and ME3 Registration Number. The Hon. Secretary of the competitor's club or organisation must also sign the entry form, to verify that the competitor's details are correct.
- 5. During the 2-hour Weigh-in period, boxers may have as many check weighs as they wish, up to the official closure of the scales. Boxers may weigh in stripped if necessary.
- 6. Gloves boxers will wear 10oz Alliance approved gloves up to 63.5kg weight category and 12oz gloves, above 63.5kg weight category. Gloves shall be supplied by the organisers. Therefore boxers shall not be allowed to wear their own gloves.
- Competitors may bring their own seconds who must wear white or plain grey trousers and white vest or white shirt or white sweater. Training shoes or boxing boots must be worn. Tracksuits or white jackets are permitted. No head wear at ringside.
  With the exception of the appointed Medical Officer(s), all mobile phones must be switched off when at ringside.
- 8. Boxers' Medical record cards (ME3) must be produced at the time of weighing in at all stages of the Championships.
- 9. For the Pre Quarter Final and Quarter Final matches, appointed Officials will be paid expenses by their own Association. Officials' expenses for the Semi Finals and Finals to be paid by the Alliance.
- 10. All boxers must wear a gum shield, cup protector and Alliance approved bandages on the hands. No red coloured gum shields may be worn.
- 11. Where both boxers in the eliminating round of a weight class are disqualified the Association or Associations jointly concerned will be permitted to nominate a representative to the next stage provided the nominee has entered and weighed-in for his Association Championships.
- 12. All participants i.e. boxers and coaches, are reminded that these Championships are subject to the Alliance Anti Doping Rules.
- 13. Scoring clickers SHALL be in operation at all rounds of these Championships using 3 ringside judges.
- 14. If there is no opponent for a boxer to compete in the National Final, he shall only be awarded the National Title if he has boxed at an earlier stage.
- 15. If necessary, to define the 'belt' line, competitors will be required to wear the appropriate colour sash. No boxer will wear a RED vest in the BLUE corner or a BLUE vest in the RED corner.
- 16. All boxers MUST wear RED gloves and Head guard in the RED corner and BLUE gloves and Head guard in the BLUE corner.
- 17. All boxers entering and participating in these championships, will automatically be upgraded to INTERMEDIATE classification.

18. Forms and a cheque for £10 must be sent to the Alliance Championship Secretary below. Cheques should be made payable to the association where the boxer is registered with i.e. Home Counties ABA, London ABA or South West ABA. If paid by Bank Transfer, a copy of the payment must be enclosed with the application or sent via email attachment to Ben Green.
